IMPORTANT MANUFACTORY.

The manufactory for cotton yarns in the neighboring county of Pike is of such immense importance to our people just now, that it might become an object with the enemy to destroy it. The destruction of the Cumberland Iron Works in Tennessee assures us that every establishment of importance to our prosperity will share like fate.

We have taken pains to inquire, and are fully satisfied that the enterprising and industrious manager, *Mr. Merrell* is conducting the operations in a manner the most advantageous to the whole community and in a spirit of justice to all. The prices charged are moderated, being considerably below those charge by similar establishments in Georgia and other parts of the South. This is the only factory here accessible to our citizens. People anxiously flock to purchase this necessary article from a hundred miles distant, and that in such numbers as to render it impossible to supply the demand. Being thus without competition *Mr. Merrell* deserves high credit for his anxiety to accommodate the wants of the community at moderate rates, when he has it in his power to act the extortioner.

MR. MERRILL AND THE COTTON FACTORY.

The "Ouachita Herald" takes notice of our article in commendation of the Pike county factory, and adds the following:

"If our neighbor of the Telegraph is not wrongly informed. Mr. Merrill is entitled not only to the thanks of the people of South Arkansas, but to a more substantial renumeration. But may not our confrere have been imposed upon to some extent. When the State Bonds were first passed into circulation, some merchants refused to take them, because, as they said, they could not replenish their stocks with them. In other words the bonds would not be received in payment in New Orleans and other places, where they made their purchases. There is now, or was a few days since, cotton yarns from Pike county Factory, for sale in this place; but change-tickets, Treasury warrants, War Bonds, or Confederate notes would not buy them, for the reason, as we are informed, that gold and silver had been paid for the goods and they must be sold for gold and silver. This may not be considered extortioning (extortion) on the part of Mr. Merrill, or the Company for whom he is acting, but it looks to us very nearly allied to it."

The original notice upon our part was prompted by the fear, that a portion of our community, might do a hasty and injudicious thing. It is a matter of popular discussion now and of course no secret. Many have become incensed with *Mr. Merrill*, and there has been much talk of taking forcible possession of his factory, and running it for the benefit of the community.

We are not personally acquainted with Mr. Merrill. We do not remember having ever met him, nor have we any business relations with any one connected with the factory. Still, as a friend of the community, desirous in these troubled times, of making the best of things, and satisfied of the incalculable advantage of this factory to our community, as now worked, we thought it our duty to present that aspect of the case to our readers. What we said was not by way of favoritism. We are anxious that our estimable housewives through the country may continue to get as least a reasonable chance at spun thread, and we are convinced that any attempts at violence upon the property of the company, would entirely stop its operation. We have no confidence that any man or body of men would undertake the charge of running the factory as a charity, and keep it up. It is notorious that "what is everybody's business is nobody's" and amidst the vexations and expenses of so extensive a business, nothing short of a master mind, prompted by hope of profit will sustain it. Ebullitions of patriotism although very magnificent at the time are notoriously short lived amongst the best of us. The humdrum and everlasting recurring cares of life wear it out monstrously. So we thought and said, and still assert that Mr. Merrill is doing good. He serves the public. That is no less true, even although he may enrich himself thereby, as is likely enough. We had better let him alone. Whether he be a bad or good man lies between him and his Maker and is no concern of ours. What we want is spun thread.

So much, by way of personal explanation partly, but at the same time addressed to the more violent and still dissatisfied portion of our community, for practical consideration.

Daniel W. Kelley was born March the 18th 1841.

AN ACT TO DEFINE THE LINE BETWEEN THE COUNTIES OF PIKE AND HEMPSTEAD.

Section 1. Boundary Line.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas, That the line between the counties of Pike and Hempstead, shall be as follows, to wit:

Commencing at *John Wood's* old ferry on the Little Missouri river; thence up said river, to the mouth of Hickory creek; thence up said creek, to the township line between townships eight and nine south, of range twenty-six west; thence west with said line to the Sevier county line.

Section 2. Provisions repugnant repealed.

SEC. 2. That so much of the acts heretofore passed, establishing the county line of Pike county, as are inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

I am attempting to put together a family group that includes these brothers: Jester Clinton Cornelius born 1819 Arkansas; William Cornelius born 1813 Missouri; and Rubin Raglin Cornelius born 1811 Missouri. Names of other probably related Cornelius include: Clabourn born 1790-1800; Henry Z. born 1801 (wife may be Sarah Crow); Jepthy/Jesse born 1800-1810; Mary born 1780-1790; Thomas J. born 1812; Citty (Letty) that married John Elkins; and Sally that married Joseph Hardin. All lived (in) Clark or Hempstead counties. Possibly included are Daniel of Lafayette County and Elihu born 1780-1790.
